 We achieved 7,130 rostered patrol hours on the beach this season, although this number is slightly down from last year, it is still a great effort by all of our 388 volunteer patrol members.

Junior Highlights (Keiron Burke) Presented by: Ron Morris – Club President

- Sorrento has the largest number of registered nippers involved in the Woodsid-Nippers Program in SLSWA
- Sorrento has the largest and most comprehensive training program
 offered to nippers along the coast. This includes Boards, Swimming (H20),
 Beach, R&R, March Past and Pool Rescue. Training is open to nippers that
 have passed the necessary proficiencies. Implementing a tiered structure
 has given us the ability to allow all nippers at whatever level an
 opportunity to have a go. Of course, this is always determined by the
 weather and qualified volunteer numbers at each training session.

- Sorrento has the largest team of Assistant Age Managers and parent voluntee in different roles throughout the club.
- Sorrento is continually embracing the competition side of surf sports. This season we had the largest numbers registering for all competitions including Little Nipper Carnivals, Nipper Carnivals and of course the Country Carnival.
- And most importantly Sorrento has the highest club attendance at any Sunday morning Woodside Nipper Program. It fills me with joy to know so many of our nippers from U/6 through to U/13 are using Sunday mornings to get educated in surf awareness, promoting community involvement, a healthy lifestyle and increasing personal fitness including family members.

Competition Highlights (Adrian Kirkpatrick) Presented by: Ron Morris – Club President

- The competition numbers in the club especially in the water has risen this
 year and our goal as a committee is to continue that trend knowing the
 Junior age managers and youth age managers with their tireless efforts are
 producing some outstanding results with their programmes, The transition
 from nippers to Youth and then to Seniors is a major focus for the committee
 going forward.
- Keeping our athletes at Sorrento is always a key target and although sometimes that is out of or control, we are aware that we must keep pushing forward with new and exciting ways to do this. As mentioned previously, the efforts of all the different areas of competition have definitely seen a rise in interested numbers from the younger members in their respective disciplines with have a go sessions and regular training.
- Well done to the Under 15 R&R team this year. They are State Champions for 2020 and had new members to the team this year and they have done an awesome job. They had the right attitude towards training and fundraising to go to the Aussies this year. Well done guys!
- To continue our vision towards 2022 with Aussies at Scarborough, the competition committee is dedicated and pushing for a huge turnout of athletes in every discipline at the event so a massive focus going forward will be in that area.
- The Coaching Panel are also looking into ways the club can train as a whole regarding U/14 to Masters on a more regular basis at all different levels.

Club Service Highlights (Peter Watkins) Presented by: Ron Morris – Club President

An upgrade of kitchen equipment, replacing the deep fryer with one twice

- the size and also adding a heating cabinet to keep food warm to cater for demand.
- There were no social functions in the early part of the season and all the
 ones planned for later in the season have been cancelled or postponed
 due to the restrictions placed on the club. I do hope our members
 understand and once the club is back up and running, we can all get
 together at a few social functions.
- Once again, the uniform shop has had its problems due to the suppliers delivering in a timely manner. Our volunteers have done a good job and even in these hard times are working towards ways to improving service in the coming season.

Club Development Highlights (Chris Milne) Presented by: Ron Morris- Club President

- Youth numbers at the club have increased from around 150 to 200 under 14s to under 19s over the past 3 years. Over 50 U13 Nippers transitioned to Youth in the 2019/20 season.
- Substantially more youth are now actively involved in regular Sunday morning youth sessions. It was important to provide the appropriate amount of structure to the Youth and allow them to participate in the activities that they and their fellow youth enjoy.
- Big numbers of youth participate in the club swim. 35 under 14 youth received SRC awards and joined patrols. 28 older youth received Bronze Medallion Awards adding fully qualified patrolling Surf Life Savers.
- Massive Youth Surf Lifesaving involvement being 3200 hours on patrols, events/ IRB.
- Additional volunteering as assistant age managers for nippers, assistant coaching and in the magnificent Dolphins program for kids and adults with a disability.
- Growing numbers taking up surf ski paddling including to competition level.
- Increasing numbers of youth (though we still want more!) doing mid-week training and competing (details under the competition section).
- Special mention to our YIP Gold Award Winners Georgie Overton, Caleb Bailey, Julius Formato, Amy Harrison, Vivien Lettner, Pia O'Flynn, Michell Prescud, Tristan Swanepoel and Kye Bostwick – Exceptional participation and volunteering guys!

9 youth received gold awards for over 400 points, 24 silver and 13 silver. Some of the volunteering aspects included:

- Assistant age managers for nippers groups.
- Water safety for nippers.

- BBQ roster.

- Volunteering for Dolphins Program to help our disabled members.
- Additional patrol hours for abalone, fireworks and other events.

2019/20 FINANCE REPORT

Presented by: Ron Morris - President

Highlights:

It is with pleasure that I present the Financial Statements for the year ended 30 April 2020. The current focus of the Club remains that our current operations are running smoothly with our future in mind.

Our future focus remains to have adequate funds available to contribute towards the proposed redevelopment of the clubrooms. We have been able to increase our building fund term deposit by \$193,291 to \$588,115 this financial year.

The club has returned a net surplus over the season of \$218,894 for the season with our member numbers continuing to rise.

Our result is favourable in this financial year in comparison to the previous year of \$48.332 due to:

- Higher memberships
- Woodside sponsorship
- Lower expenses recognised within the financial year.

It is important to also note, the club experienced higher levels of trading profit for bar and restaurant activities throughout the year. This was offset by the Covid 19 closures and cessation of trading in late March and April.

The club experienced an increase in our net asset position as at 30 April 2020 to \$1,320,670.

The finance across all service areas were monitored and disciplined throughout the year, with all major items of a capital nature requiring board approval.

Capital expenditure incurred during the season included:

- Ford Ranger (\$38k before grant)
- Fryer and Warmer (\$8.3k)
- Chairs Sebel (\$3.4k)
- Commercial Fridge (\$2.6k)
- SSV Defender BRP Australia (\$10.2k)
- 2 soft rescue boards (\$2.3k)
- Epic Kayaks (\$2.5k)
- BOS Double Ski (\$5k)
- Improved Building Access (\$2.7k)
- Juniors Board Cage and Racks (\$2.3k)

• Foam Nipper Boards x 15 (\$7.7k)

All these items were considered essential for the ongoing running of the club across relevant sections.

The Board has not recommended an increase in membership fees for the upcoming season.

I would like to thank the Board and our administration staff for their support over the past 12 months.

Ron asked the floor is they had any questions about the finance section from the 2020/21 season.

Ken Jenner – Ken asked why don't we have the splits in the trading account. Adam Duffy asked Ken to clarify what he meant by this. Ken answered and said the bar is getting charged all the cleaning fees for the whole club and not just for the bar or function hall. Why don't we spilt this all. Ron said to Ken we can do this for next season.

Andrew Ridley mentioned that it is not bad that we charge it to the bar so that it reduces the look of any income, makes us look better for the new building.

Ken – I just think from an accounting side of things, the bar should be charged for the bar and everything else to should be charged in there area.

Ron – Would you like to vote on this now or will it go to the board.

Glenn Ridley – Can I suggest that the board look into it and do some research on it before any decisions are made.

Ron agreed.

Ron asked if there was any other questions.

Craig Croke mentioned that the boat results were missed out of the annual report. Jess Bunford replied and said we can add them in and sorry for the mistake.

Building Update

Presented by: Rob Doherty

Further to our club submitting a detailed business case and detailed concept plans to the City of Joondalup (the city), the councillors discussed our proposed project in some detail at a council meeting in which we attended.

It was encouraging to witness that the majority of the councillors were in agreeance that our club is just about at its use by date and a new facility will be required in the near future.

The one major sticking point relates to the proposed cost of the project, at this point in time it is estimated the project to be worth some nine million dollars.

The councillors proposed and agreed that the city budget an approximate \$65,000 for the following.

The City is planning to engage consultants to develop further concept plans and cost estimates for this project to enable Council to consider including the project in the City's 20 Year Strategic Financial Plan.

Within this concept will be an option for the city to include a commercial tenancy with the prospect of a possible rental return to help recoup some of the capital outlay.

The expression of interest is in the infancy stage of engaging architects for the city's proposal.

The general consensus is that our club would be expected to contribute some 10% of the costs associated with the project.

Years spent in other Life Saving obligations requiring patrol exemption, will count toward the eight years of service required for Active Reserve membership.

or she shall be exempted from patrol duties, except under special circumstances in which an authorised Officer of the Club may call upon him. Reserve Active members are to complete the Surf Life Saving Australia's annual skills maintenance to maintain competency in the award, at the beginning of each season. Years spent in other Life Saving obligations requiring patrol exemption, will count toward the eight years of service required for Reserve Active membership.

2.4 (h)

Such membership may be granted by the Club to persons who have completed a minimum of ten (10) years Active service, or to members who have completed a minimum of eight (8) years Active service plus four (4) years Active Reserve service. Long Service members shall be exempt from all patrol obligations and may be granted other special privileges of membership as deemed applicable by the Board of Management of the day. In exceptional circumstances the Board may grant such a membership to an Active Reserve member irrespective of the number of years served



Training

Board Training

On the other extreme, Bill's Board Squad returned, it gave our more competitive athletes exposure to the Trigg and Scarborough swell for a big chunk of the season. This Squad was an invite-only with conditions such as safety and ability taken into account. Beach Training

Again, our numbers grew and were consistent through the season with numbers around 70+ most weeks, going over 100 in the lead up to states. Changing to a stand-alone training on a Friday was a great idea for our Beach program. Grant along with Stef, Belly and a few others that jumped into assist provided a great opportunity for all Nippers that where keen to improve on the beach.

R&R Training

Theresa, along with her crew of coaches, quietly goes about their business. Many people wouldn't know but these guys have had a tremendous strike rate in picking up placings in competition, putting us on top of the leader board at the end of R&R

state. You might be a quiet lot, but we love the work your crew is putting in; keep it up.

Swim Training

We have significant numbers attending our Sorrento affiliate Squad at H2O sessions available three times a week. Andrew and his team keep providing a professional structured session plan that is getting great results. Andrew also created a weekly surf skills session at Scarborough about seven weeks before states open to all Sorrento athletes competing at states. It was very beneficial, and thank you for adding it to the program again this season.

Junior and Little Nipper Comps

This year we again had the biggest participation numbers ever at carnivals representing the MIGHTY TEAM GREEN. I believe this has been driven by the encouragement of Age Managers, Coaches and parents. Sometimes it's just about giving it a crack and having fun.

Little Nipper States

Well, what a huge Sunday this was to see the under 8/9 strut their stuff on our very own beach, in what was one of the highlights of the season. Such a great contingent of green having a crack and giving it a go. I left the beach thinking the future is looking extremely bright at Sorrento.



CLUB DEVELOPMENT REPORT

GREG BELMONT

Objectives of Sorrento Youth Program

Youth (U14-U19) are a vital part the future of our club.

The main objectives of the Youth Program are:

- Lifesaving: Transition our nippers into becoming patrolling lifesaver members, as well as retaining and developing Youth into more competent and capable lifesavers as they move from SRC to Bronze qualifications as well as other more advanced qualifications
- 2. Competition: Encourage competition, build greater numbers competing, work towards more competition success and team spirit.
- Camaraderie: Provide the opportunity for the Youth to develop and continue friendships within the Sorrento Youth Community in a safe environment and to continue involvement with the Club and the broader community.

A key objective of the 20/21 season was to provide a structured program that focuses on:

- Retaining existing Youth members,
- Attracting new Youth Members, and
- Providing a pathway for Nippers to transition to Youth

The table below details the 2020/21 season numbers compared to the prior season.

Memberships were down in a number of age groups compared to the prior season, and the build of numbers earlier in the season slower than prior years. This is potentially due to a number of COVID related challenges.

Regardless, the Youth group remains strong with 162 members for the season and a group of 50 to 60 Youth participating most Sunday sessions.

The Youth committee ran several activities to engage with the U13 Age Group (red caps) to ensure that they and their parents are well informed of the range of activities available to those nippers progressing to Youth for the 21/22 season. We

look forward to them joining us next season.

Lifesaving Skills and Volunteering Initiatives-Bronze, SRC and other Courses

Seamlessly transitioning Nippers into SRC qualified Lifesavers is a critical activity in retaining Youth as they transition from U13s (Nippers) to U14 (Youth). This serves several important functions:

- 1. Ensures a stream of SRC qualified lifesavers to bolster the ranks of existing Patrols at the beginning of each season
- 2. Fulfil the aspirations of a significant number of Nippers who look forward to becoming Patrolling members of the Surf club
- 3. SRC and Bronze qualifications are a minimum requirement for those Youth who wish to compete

COVID 19 restrictions during 2020 disrupted the normal program of courses conducting during the year. It was not possible to offer the Easter SRC course during Easter in 2020 due to COVID, as well as 2021 due to clash with School Holidays lack of trainers across the school holiday break.

SRC and Bronze courses were conducted during the Sept / Oct School holidays in the 2020 as well as several additional courses throughout the season.

These courses would not be available without the support and dedication of many volunteer trainers and support staff.

Planning is underway for courses during the 2021 / 22 season with initial focus on the SRC and Bronze courses for the 2021 Sept / Oct school holidays. This will provide the next cohort of SRC qualified Lifesavers to support the 21/22 season.

Sunday Morning Sessions

The Youth committee worked tirelessly during the 2020/21 season to provide structured Sunday sessions. One of the key challenges identified by the Youth committee during the season is how to provide a range of activities that appeal across the U14-U19 spectrum. While Nipper groups are focused on individual age groups, the current format of the Youth combines the U14 to U19 age groups. The current age distribution of Youth attending the Sunday session is mainly from the younger age groups, with the Youth committee continuing to explore options to increase attendance across the age spectrum.

The Sunday session is the main point of contact between the Youth and the Club during the season. As such, activities were designed so that youth were able to explore all the possibilities offered by the club and find what suited them best as well as developing and reinforcing existing skills. Competitive and non-competitive options were offered, within a structured format.

This included:

- Sunday Morning Club Swim Youth join seniors for the social competition of the club swim over a 200 or 400 metre course.
- Main Sunday Morning Youth Session Youth Managers ran a mix of semi competitive and lifesaving-based activities including beach flags, beach sprints, boards, tubes, swim and irons.
- Surf-Ski Program A pathway for youth to learn, develop and then compete
 on surf-skis Starts with Have a go Day for under 14's at Hillary's Marina,
 followed by six lessons for under 15's, and a development squad for older
 youth on Sunday mornings. In addition, a dedicated ski camp was held
 across the Easter school holidays
- "Have a go" sessions on IRB and Surf boats
- Combined session with the Scarboro Surf lifesaving
- Lifesaving and first aid scenarios
- Team building and leadership activities

In addition to the above, a number of the Youth participated in structured activities as part of the SLSWA Youth pathways program. These included:

- Youth Age Manager
- Youth Official
- Youth Trainer
- Youth Coach

There has been considerable interest expressed by the Youth across the range of Youth Program Pathways that are on offer. An overview of the SLSWA Youth Pathways programs available to the Youth is shown below:



Youth Incentive Program (YIP)

The YIP initiative encourages youth to participate in club events and volunteering. The majority of the youth formally signed up for the program which awards points towards prizes.

Some of the volunteering aspects included:

- Assistant age managers for nippers' groups
- Water safety for nippers
- Water safety for carnivals and events
- BBQ roster

- Volunteering for Dolphins Program to help our disabled members
- Additional patrol hours for abalone, fireworks and other events

Over 30 prizes were awarded for the season which included either Sorrento towels, Jackets or backpacks. In addition, some Youth decided to carry over points to the next season.

Youth Wind up

As a result of COVID, there were two wind up functions during the 20/21 season. The first was to close out the 2019 / 20 season that had been cancelled and took place on Sunday 11th Oct. The event was well attended and as well as serving as the wind up, enabled the Committee and others to take the Youth through the activities that would be taking place during the 20/21 season. The incoming group of U14's was invited to this session as a means of welcoming them back to the new season.

As 2022/21 end of season function was held on Saturday 10th April. This involved a day trip to Adventure World, followed by an awards session and dinner at the club. This event was well attended by both Youth and parents.

Youth Social and Fundraising Activities

There was a strong cohort of parents and Youth interested in the social and fundraising side of Youth activities. There was excellent support from the Youth Committee, parents and youth for the fund-raising activities at the Sorrento Nipper carnival on 13th Dec. which included:

Youth Development Opportunities

The key focus on the Development Director and the Youth Committee during the 2020/21 season was the delivery of a structured program for the Sorrento Youth Group and re-energising the group after the disruptions of COVID. While this consumed much of the time during the season, there has been some reflect on the learnings from the completed season. The key question to the be addressed is how to translate strong Nipper attendance, involvement and performance into the

Youth sphere. This will be a key area of attention during the off season and should include, but not be limited to:

- Development of a Strategic plan for Youth Development across a 3-5year timeframe.
- Development of a Communications strategy that utilises a range of communications mediums that are accessible and desirable for Youth and parents
- Development of the capability to deliver SRC and Bronze training within the Youth Committee and support group
- Increasing the connection and uptake of the SLSWA Pathways programs
- Building closer connection to the Competition committee and Competition's strategy
- Consideration of involvement and retention of older Youth Age Groups (U17 & U19)
- Consideration of reinstatement of the roles of Youth Captains and other leadership opportunities
- Assessment of the Award programs to be used (YIPS / YLP)
- Development of Sorrento Youth camps utilising the new SLSWA Camp facilities
- Utilisation of Plans and learnings from other Clubs Youth Programs



Men's crew are at the same stage and are also building towards Aussies next season.

FINANCE REPORT

MATTHEW THOMSON

The Directors are pleased to present the Financial Statements for the year ended 30 April 2021. The focus for the year was to ensure the Club navigated the uncertainty of the COVID 19 pandemic, kept current operations running smoothly, and with an eye to the future continued to push forward with the new clubrooms building project.

The club has returned a net surplus over the season of \$153,819, whilst down on the exceptional prior year it is a pleasing result given the current environment. Memberships were down on the prior year by 10% but above target set for the year – we are aware that the average decrease in memberships across a number of summer sporting organisations was > 20% due to uncertainty on the season, the way season 19/20 ended and other financial reasons. We have seen an increase in trading through the Restaurant and Bar through additional functions and offerings but also a testament to the support from the members for the year.

Sponsorships and Fundraising proved a challenge for the year with sponsorship inflows dropping by 30%, although it was pleasing to note most of the major sponsors supported the club again this year. With a full season on the beach, we were able to have a complete suite of Carnivals and State Championships from Little Nippers to Master's increasing the fundraising & carnival income (including payments for hosting events) vs the prior year.

Finally on Income, the Club was able to qualify for the Governments Job Keeper and Cashflow Boost assistance programs which contributed circa \$62k to help support the operations of the Club during the year. There was an additional \$15k of wages paid to staff as part of the Job Keeper program, regular fortnightly wages were topped up to a minimum payment.

With an expected drop in Income the Directors set a budget for expenditure which reflected the expected lower income, all service areas were monitored, and disciplined spending occurred throughout the year, with all major items of a capital nature requiring board approval.

Following additional turnover in the Restaurant and Bar operating costs increased, whilst the full season and additional coaching expenses led to an increase on the prior year for Competition, Youth and Juniors expenses. The largest increase in operating expenditure was in Administration which increased due to the

reintroduction of the annual membership payments to SLSWA – these had been waivered for 19/20 but reintroduced this year.

Fundraising Expenses related to distribution of all profits from the Watermans to the Wall event. Depreciation also increased following the accumulation of additional watercraft assets over the previous years.

Capital expenditure incurred during the season included:

- First Aid Room Equipment (\$1.9k)
- Modifications to the Ford Ranger (\$2.6k)
- New Foam and Fibreglass Nipper Boards (\$17.8k)
- New Portable BBQ (\$1.6k)

All these items were considered essential for the ongoing running of the club across relevant sections.

The club experienced an increase in our net asset position as at 30 April 2021 to \$1,474,490.

Our future focus remains to have adequate funds available to contribute towards the proposed redevelopment of the clubrooms. We have been able to increase our building fund term deposit by \$208,891 to \$797,006 this financial year.

The Board has not recommended an increase in membership fees for the upcoming season, with the Building Levy to remain in place until the final cost of the Clubrooms development is known.

On behalf of the Board, I would like to thank and our administration staff for their support over the past 12 months.

Accordingly, as the evidence available to us regarding revenue from these sources was limited, our audit procedures with respect to donations and other fundraising activity revenue had to be restricted to the amounts recorded in the financial records. We therefore are unable to express an opinion on whether donations and other fundraising activity revenue obtained by The Sorrento Surf Life Saving Club are complete.

Qualified audit opinion

In our opinion, except for the effects on the financial report of such adjustments, if any, as might have been required had the limitation on our audit procedures referred to in the qualification paragraph not existed, the financial report presents fairly in accordance with the accounting policies, the financial position of The Sorrento Surf Life Saving Club at 30 April 2021 and the results of its operations and its cash flows for the year then ended.




