

	• Highlights for the season, Surplus for the year ended 30 th April 2015 was \$38 965 with net assets of
	 \$776,152 Building Levy raised \$12,060 for the year. These funds were raised \$7,000 from Active 18+ members
	and \$5,000 from New Member Nomination Fees
	• Architects fees of \$2,500 were spent during the year with a further \$2,500 committed for the 2015/16 year.
	• A total of \$9,500 has been allocated to the Building Reserve on the Balance Sheet
	• Income for the year increased by \$40,000 due to new sponsorship of \$10k from Hillarys Marina.
	 Expenses increased by comparatively less at \$2,500. The Bar, Restaurant and Clothing showed a surplus of \$24,000 after a tough year in the prior yea The club invested in approx \$70,000 of capital assets in 2014/15-:

Martina responded that it is correct per the accounting standards to include depreciation in the profit and loss as the Club operates on an accruals

basis and not a cash basis. Neil disagreed with the response provided and Martina explained the concept of depreciation as provided for the write down in the value of capital assets

	The Year that was
	 Rob, opened his Presidents report by acknowledging the Board of Directors, this season there were 5 new directors: <u>Club Services</u>, Leanne Lewis; <u>Club Development Director</u>, Ron Clarke; <u>Competition Director</u>, Claire Rafferty and himself. He stated that they BOM did an outstanding job during the season. As a Board of Directors Rob felt that they stuck to the club values and the club motto, by providing a safe beach environment for the community while embracing a family atmosphere and participating in the enjoying success in competition. Rob mentioned that his role at the Club President was an easy one, due to every director successfully managing their various disciplines. Rob thanked the club staff: Kerry Yates; Shannon Saunders and the newly appointed Mike
	Wren into the Bar Manager role.
	Rob also thanked all the volunteers and bar staff.
	Rob mentioned that Peta Watkins has taken over as the clubs bookkeeper.
	PATROL REBATE – Robert Doherty
	 Rob informed all members that the Patrol Rebate would be changing for the 2016/2017 season. All members that complete 24 patrolled hours during the 2015/16 season will receive a \$60 voucher that can be used in the So Café or Uniform shop. The \$60 will not be taken off their membership fees.
	 This way the funds go directly back into the Surf Club. Eg: for the 2014/15 season there were: 376 Patrolling Members 157 received the Patrol Rebate (discount of \$60)
	Therefore the club lost \$9,420 (157x\$60) on club membership fees. If all patrolling members got their patrol rebate it would be \$22,560 (376 x \$60)
	BUILDING RE-DEVELOPMENT – Robert Doherty & Daniel Walton
	• Rob explained that the SoSLSC Building Re-development was going to be transpiring. As Martina explained that funds have already been set aside and this project is now up and running with the support from, local government; City of Joondalup; Lottery West and other partnerships.
	 It is an amazing concept for the club that will require support and funding from all members. The Building Committee consists of: Daniel Walton; Graham Nash; Ron Clarke; Mick Saunders Rob Doherty; with Ken Jenner playing a huge role in this committee.
	 <u>The project objectives were discussed</u>: Provides facilities to support core function of Sorrento SLSC
	 Services the current and forecast members numbers
	 Support the development of junior and youth members
	 Allows development of member and community training
	 Addresses issues with maintenance and life cycles of the existing facility
	 Address health and safety aspects of the existing building



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The project scope was discussed:

- 3. <u>Training Facilities</u>
 - a. 4 off training rooms
- 4. Improved Amenities
- 5. <u>Recreational Facilities</u>
- 6. Foreshore
 - Separation of club services areas and public

The project risks would be-:

- Funding commitments from government agencies
- Raising funds from members
- Planning approvals for increase building site
- Expectations of members

The proposed Building Levy -:

- Rob Doherty proposed an amendment to the levy which was implemented last year. The new proposal is suggested as-:
- All members are to pay the building Levy
- \$20 for all Active Individual Members
- \$50 Family Cap. There are no specific categories that define a family membership relating to

the building levy; it is simply a cap of more than two members. Included in the proposal was

that all new member nominations fee's again be allocated to the building levy.

Neil Rowse asked if it would be a better option to bulldoze the entire club down and re-build it from scratch, similar to what they have done at Perth City. Due to relocation and the operational aspects of keeping the club running, this would not be an option.

Janie Rowse asked why all members don't just pay \$50 each for the building levy. Rob, mentioned he didn't want to put a financial struggle onto families, as some families consist of 4-6 members.

Rob mentioned that the Building Levy will be tightly managed and payments will be followed up on. Each member will be looked at in an individual capacity and the Directors will chase up those members not paying their building levy.

Changes to the Age Groups:

- Next season the U/14's will be competing in the Senior Competitions.
- U14/U15's will still be doing group activities on a Sunday along with the U17 and U19 doing group activities. These groups will be named Junior Youth and Senior Youth. These age groups will we the Sorrento Cap and not a Nipper Cap.
- Athletes will now train in their chosen disciplines during the week.

Club Events::

Grants- Mick Saunders

In the last financial year we have applied for over 15 grants to assist us in providing our services to both the community and our members. The grants we have applied for have ranged in value from \$3,500 to \$100,000, out of all these applications only 4 where successful. Equipment Report

This season we finally had the roll out and implementation of the new digital radios with assistance of sponsorship from BHP to Surf Life Saving WA, enabling better communications into surfcom, and clearer communications on dedicated channels for critical or mass rescue situations.

With allocation of funds to surf lifesaving area of the club, we purchased more new soft rescue boards to assist in training of new members, and enabled more water safety numbers for events for the season.

As well as an additional new 30 rescue tubes replacing some of our well-worn older ones, and providing more equipment to assist with covering water safety for our nippers groups, abalone patrols and rostered weekend patrols.

With the accumulation of the additional first aid and oxy equipment bags, we were able to stock up and have response ready first aid and oxygen assistance packs for the Patrol tent, ATV and out in the patrol area at Hillarys.

With great news from the perseverance of Mick Saunders submissions for grants, and thanks to lan Goodenough, we have received a grant to assist with the purchase of an upgrade to the patrol ute for next season, which will also enable some additions which will assist with set up of nippers and competition equipment on the beach. **Craig Gamble**

Junior Report – Ian Smallwood



This year we had 542 nippers join our club which is slightly down on previous years after making allowances for the U14s joining the Senior ranks.

This was seen by attendances at junior carnivals with the numbers dropping to their lowest in a number of years. The junior committee is going to attempt to turn this around in the following season with some new initiatives.

The carnival format as we know it is going to be radically changed for the coming season.

The changes are based on feedback over a number of years and hopefully will improve the carnival experience for all participants.

- Separate, Beach and Water carnivals
- Saturday and Sunday carnivals

Nippers not taking part in carnivals have been looked after by a dedicated group of age managers at Sorrento over the last couple of years. This initiative was bought in to cater for the non-competitive kids that still wanted to participate and feel like they were being left out. Hopefully some of these nippers go on to be our future lifesavers.

Age Groups

This season we had the U14s move up to the senior ranks so we gave the Red Cap a rest for one season and had space to create another group or more precisely, split a group. For the 2016 – 2017 season the Red Cap will make a comeback and the Yellow Cap will take a year off.

Finance Report – Martina Crowley



I am pleased to present the Financial Statements for the year ended 30 April 2016.

The Club presents a surplus of \$44,839 and the net asset position is \$811,951 as at 30 April 2016.

I would like to thank the Board for assisting with the delivery of a surplus again this year. The finances across all service areas are well planned and disciplined.

The Building Levy raised \$18,322 during the year. From this \$9,015 was expended on the planning stages for the new building. The balance of \$9,307 has been allocated to the Building Reserve on the Balance Sheet.

Hall Hire revenue increased by \$23,000 this year, an example of the great work done by Leanne Lewis, Club Services Director and Mike Wren, Bar Manager. Our facilities are an important asset of the Club and should be used to produce income when the members do not need use of the rooms.

A major highlight for the year was the successful sourcing of a grant for the purchase of a New Ute to the extent of \$18,400 from the Federal Government, which funds 50% of the cost of the vehicle. The Grant will be reported in the 2017 year as the cash was received in May 2016.

Report on the financial report

We have audited the accompanying financial report, being a special purpose financial report, of The Sorrento Surf Life Saving Club, which comprises the Balance Sheet as at 30 April 2016, and the Trading Account and Statement of Income and Expenditure for the year then ended, a summary of significant accounting policies, other explanatory notes and the Management Committee declaration.

The responsibility of the Management Committee for the financial report

In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial report in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by those charged with governance, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial report.

The association's Management Committee are responsible for the integrity of The Sorrento Surf Life Saving Club website. We have not been engaged to report on the integrity of The Sorrento Surf Life Saving Club website. The auditor's report refers only to the statements named above. It does not provide an opinion on any other information which may have been hyperlinked to / from these statements. If users of this report are concerned with the inherent risks arising from electronic data communications they are advised to refer to the hard copy of the audited financial report to confirm the information included in the audited financial report presented on this website.

Qualification

Receipts from donations, bar takings and other fundraising activities are a significant source of revenue for The Sorrento Surf Life Saving Club non-reporting entity. The Sorrento Surf Life Saving Club has determined that it is impracticable to establish control over the collection of donations and other fundraising activity revenue prior to entry in its financial records. Accordingly, as the evidence available to us regarding revenue from these sources was limited, our audit procedures with respect to donations and other fundraising activity revenue had to be restricted to the amounts recorded in the financial records. We therefore are unable to express an opinion on whether donations and other fundraising activity revenue obtained by The Sorrento Surf Life Saving Club are complete.

Qualified audit opinion

In our opinion, except for the effects on the financial report of such adjustments, if any, as might have been required had the limitation on our audit procedures referred to in the qualification paragraph not existed, the financial report presents fairly in accordance with the accounting policies described in Note 1 to the financial statements, the financial position of The Sorrento Surf Life Saving Club at 30 April 2016 and the results of its operations and its cash flows for the year then ended.

Along with many of our new competitors came their parents, many of whom were very willing to assist when called upon. This was much appreciated and added enormously to our team approach mentioned previously.



The seasoned campaigners of our team as usual provided incredible support, John Hackett, our beach captain, Peta Watkins and Aaron Bell assisted greatly when it came to training and marshalling at States and Aussies. Clarie Rafferty, our amazing competition director, without who, most of the boys in the squad would never be entered made my life as a coach so much easier. Jeremy Plint who has been part of the beach team for so long he is the heart and soul of the team as well as being a Mentor to our squad and helps to keep training fun.

Jeff Carter the Sorrento strength and conditioning coach also played a vital role in ensuring our athletes improved their performance by increasing strength and power as well as preventing injury. It was evident in those athletes who consistently attended Jeff's sessions.

It was very pleasing to see so many new faces join the senior team this season. All were committed to train to extract the best out of themselves and the added depth led to competition for places in relay teams. To think that only a couple of years ago the sprinters were dominated in numbers by male competitors – now the never seen before sight of 12 young ladies standing on the podium at the State Championships with bronze, silver and gold medals around their necks filled many with pride and must have sent a shiver down the spine of other clubs.

Their dominance at States and Aussies was a direct result of the effort at training and how the athletes listen and implemente the skills they were being taught. The maturity the under 14 and 15 girls conducted themselves with in the difficult relay selection process and the support they gave to one and another, despite possibly not making the first relay team, should make their parents proud.

The 2015/2016 season also saw an extremely strong group of U17 and U19 men develop. The enthusiasm for training and the effort they put in showed in the amazing results they achieved at both State and Australian Titles level. They are definitely the work horses of the team with the majority running in 2 relays, as well as competing up in Open events at States.

As noted by the competition committee, this season Sorrento achieved their best results at both the State Championships and the Aussies. The Beachies were able to contribute to this in a major way and show a depth that other clubs would envy. Many of these performances can be attributed to the thorough preparation and support that been afforded to our athletes. Whilst the Sorrento Beachies performed admirably in many individual events this season, it was pleasing to see how much we still value the team relay events.

The results from States and Aussies are listed below (please note Masters States results were not listed). Overall at States we had 30 competitors and came away with 32 medals, the depth of our squad saw us take out gold, silver and bronze in multiple events including:

- Open male sprint
- U17 male flags
- U15 female flags (we actually got top 4)
- U15 female relay (thanks to our U14's running up)

We also gained dual medals in the U19 sprint and U15 Sprint. Charlie Rigby and Tom Hodgkin had amazing States campaigns, winning gold medals in all of their age group events as well as being a part in the open relay, and Charlie came 2nd to Jackson in the open male sprint earning him the athlete of the state competition. The team work showed in flags drew comments from the crowd such as "Are Sorrento going to let anyone else win this weekend?".

Aussies saw the team continue their success across Youth, Masters and Open competition, coming away with 6 gold, 2 silver and 2 bronze, from a squad of 22. The Sorrento team



camaraderie and support across the beach and the water did not go unnoticed with even announcers commenting on how loud our cheer squads were.

Our Youth did extremely well considering their age and for many of them it was their first national competition. All of our squad made it to quarter, semi or finals in each event we entered. Day 1 of Aussies saw us win our first medal. We had 2 teams in the U15 female relay final with our 1st team narrowly being beaten by, on paper a much quicker team, getting a silver and the U14/15 combined team coming 8th after a dropped baton. The sprints were also very successful with Sydney Rafferty and Crisitan Sayers making the final and coming 7th in the u15 female and U14 male sprint.

Day 2 we saw more outstanding performances with Tai Kirkpatrick focused and coming away with our second medal in 2 days, a bronze in the U14 flags. Many of our squad got through to quarters and semi-finals which was extremely impressive.

The Masters continued the winning streak with our core team coming away with medals and in the 30-35 female age group, all 3 competitors making Aussie finals! From the first flags get up it was clear Sue Waite was always going to take out gold and Aaron Bell came away with individual gold in the sprints. The 140+ relay team which dominated at State level continued that domination with a convincing win at Aussies. Stef Yujnovich and Janie Rowse finished off the Masters competition coming away with bronze medals in the flags.

In Open we took a relatively small squad of 8 members over. This was not reflected in our results. Seasoned Aussie campaigners Jackson Symonds, Paul Kappeler and Jackie Lord assisted in warm ups and marshalling and generally providing advice to our younger members.

Thursday was the sprint and relay finals. In the sprints, out of 8 competitors, 4 made it through to the semis, and both relay teams made the finals. This resulting in 3 gold medals in the space of about 15 minutes. Jackson and Charlie made the sprint finals, Jackson won back the open male sprint title convincingly and Charlie made people sit up and take notice when at the 60m mark he was well in front and managed to take out the gold in the U17 male sprint. The U17 relay team shocked me and most of the crowd by coming away with the gold in the U17 relay, winning by about 20m.

In flags, 4 out of 8 athletes made the flags final. Caleb Paulus, Sam Hodgkin and Charlie Rigby all making the U17 flags final and Tom Hodgkin making the U19 final. The boys did themselves proud coming 8th, 6th and 5th respectively in the U17s, and 8th in the U19 and finishing up an extremely successful Aussies campaign.

I would like to once again thank everyone who assisted and supported our team this year, without which we would not have achieved the results we have. Last but not least all our amazing Sorrento Beachie athletes who put in the hard work all season and were rewarded with incredible results! Please see all beach results for this season listed at the back of the annual report.
